Monday, August 31	For our nation, its politicians and its people to work together to bring about reconciliation and peace so urgently needed.
Tuesday, September 1	For the public schools of Loudon County by name, Eaton Elementary, Ft. Loudon Elementary, Greenback, Highland Park Elementary, Lenoir City Elementary, Lenoir City Middle, Lenoir City High, Loudon County High, Loudon County Technical, North Middle, Philadelphia Elementary, Steekey Elementary. Keep all teachers, children, staff and administrations safe.
Wednesday, September 2	For those going through a major life crisis who are unable to pray for themselves.
Thursday, September 3	The Loudon County and Lenoir City police departments and community be protected from harm.
Friday, September 4	That we may be bold in our faith and witness so those outside the faith will be drawn to Christ.
